## ACADEMIC SUCCESS

### The Need

18% of young people in Ada County fail to graduate from high school on time.<sup>2</sup>

### What We Do

Our educational programs help ensure kids will be successful in school, keeping them learning throughout the summer, and helping them daily with their homework.

### Our Impact

Among our teen-aged Club members, **93%** expect to graduate from high school, and **71%** expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

### The Need

30% of high-school youth in Ada County were involved in a physical fight in the past year.<sup>3</sup>

### What We Do

Our leadership and volunteer programs empower youth to grow their leadership skills, speak out against violence, and become citizens with a passion for helping others.

### Our Impact

**78%** of Club teen members volunteer in their community at least once per year, while **72%** volunteer in their community at least once per month.

## HEALTHY LIFESTYLES

### The Need

30% of young people ages 6-18 in Ada County are overweight or obese.<sup>4</sup>

### What We Do

Our programs help youth engage in positive behaviors that nurture their well-being and overall health. The Club also offers free, healthy meals, daily exercise, and sports programs.

### Our Impact

**90%** of Club members ages 9 and older report getting at least an hour of physical activity on five or more days per week.
